## bias - MSS 1

*Bias*: a strong opinion about something or someone - a bias may be in favor or against a person or a thing

*Prejudice:* an unfair judgment against someone or something

**Discrimination:** an unfair choice made against one person or group and in favor of another person or choice

7.	The teacher consistently gave girls better grades than boys
8.	The new manager thought that people with tattoos didin't have good work ethics.
